What is the Create Great Campaign?

Create Great is a capital campaign aimed at expanding the reach of leadership through *Leader in Me*. The goal is to expand the number of schools implementing *Leader in Me* across the Waterloo-Cedar Falls metro area. GIVING

Why should I consider giving to the Create Great Campaign?

With your help, we can develop tomorrow's leaders today through *Leader in Me* and shape the workforce for the Cedar Valley by preparing all students with the essential skills they need to thrive in career, college, and citizenship. This is a unique and impactful opportunity to invest in our students, schools, and community.

Has a foundation or 501(c)(3) been established?

Yes, the Leader Valley Foundation (formerly known as the Greater Cedar Valley Alliance Foundation) was established in 2012 with the classification of "public charity". Contributions to the Create Great campaign are managed within this Foundation. Financial oversight for the foundation is provided by the Leader Valley Council and Greater Cedar Valley Alliance Finance Committee.

Can I direct how my gift will be used?

Of course! There are a few options for directing your gift! You are free to designate the restrictions you would like placed on your gift.

The launch costs are general costs specific to implementation and administration of *Leader in Me*. This includes onboarding all of our Cedar Valley schools through the 3-4 year LIM process. These costs may include, but are not limited to workshop materials, facilitator costs, or student implementation materials. They can also include administrative expenditures such as Leader Valley staff working with the schools, events like a regional *Leader in Me* Symposium, special workshops to update parents, public and school district communications, or project evaluation that measures *Leader in Me* impact.

The endowment costs will be utilized to offset the ongoing expenses for *Leader in Me* schools after they have completed their initial implementation phase. By designating a gift to the endowment, you are ensuring longevity of implementation with the schools and that the leadership culture established by *Leader in Me* is nurtured for generations to come.

How will my gift be recognized?

What are the payment options?

You may provide either a one-time gift or a pledge with a multi-payment commitment over the next 3-4 years. You may also contribute through an employer matching gift or a gift of stock. You may pay your gift with check, credit card, or electronic funds transfer.

Credit is not recommended for larger gifts. Please note there are transaction fees that may reduce the total amount of the gift received.

What happens to my contribution if Leader in Me isn't fully implemented?

The short answer is that it would still go to making the Cedar Valley a better place to learn! The funds are contributed to Leader Valley Foundation. The Leader Valley Foundation is managed by a board of directors representing PreK-12 and higher educational institutions, and a wide variety of large and small businesses and parents.

While its first and only initiative is the *Leader in Me*, Leader Valley intends to implement programming to improve opportunities for well-prepared traditional and non-traditional students to start careers in the Cedar Valley. Your funds would always be used to improve student preparation. Moreover, that's why the current fundraising campaign is being implemented in two phases: operational and endowment. Endowed funds will be used exclusively to sustain only *The Leader in Me* initiative. Finally, if Leader Valley Foundation were to dissolve, it could only move its funds to another 501c3 organization, and we would rely on the board of directors to place those funds in a manner consistent with its mission.

LEADER VALLEY & LEADER IN ME

What is Leader Valley?

Leader Valley is a long-range talent development initiative of the Greater Cedar Valley Alliance and Chamber, comprised of leaders from business and PreK-12 education, and higher education. Leader Valley aims to fill the gap between traditional school curriculum and the skills and knowledge that our business community is seeking in their future employees. Leader Valley's investment seeks to enhance the Cedar Valley talent pool and help our local businesses become more competitive in the global marketplace. How are Leader Valley staff funded? Are they funded by the Greater Cedar Valley Alliance and Chamber?

Despite Leader Valley being a subsidiary of the Greater Cedar Valley Alliance & Chamber, the Leader Valley staff are not funded by the Greater Cedar Valley Alliance & Chamber. Leader Valley staff are fully funded by the Leader Valley Foundation.

What is Leader in Me? How is that different than Leader Valley?

Leader in Me is the first initiative under the Leader Valley umbrella. *Leader in Me* is a school-wide initiative dedicated to transforming our PreK-12 school cultures toward leadership. *Leader in Me* schools engage in a three-year process that integrates leadership development into all facets of the school culture and operations.

Leader in Me in the Cedar Valley has four major impact goals:

- 1. All students will learn and apply the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People.
- 2. All students will identify and utilize their unique gifts and talents.
- 3. All students will have authentic learning and leadership opportunities at the classroom, schoolwide, and community levels.
- 4. All students will develop essential skills that prepare them for career, college, and citizenship.

When will The Leader in Me Expand to Other School Districts?

That's entirely up to you! Leader Valley is building the "platform" that parents and school leaders in other Cedar Valley districts can use to implement *The Leader in Me*. The Leader Valley team is available to meet with parents and school leadership. They will familiarize you with the philosophy, implementation processes and schedules, and (current) costs. The LVF relationships can be leveraged to the benefit of your efforts and budget. Though we cannot offer any direct funding, you will have the most experienced local implementation team in the nation working with you to succeed. In some respects, the impact felt by *Leader in Me* has already stretched into neighboring communities, because some parents or grandparents of children in *Leader in Me* schools may be employed by a business there. Conversely, some teachers at *Leader in Me* schools in Waterloo or Cedar Falls may reside in an outlying community.
